#### **New Business**

#### **Discussion of Tax-Foreclosed Property Title Transfer**

Stanchina imparted that 510 Houghteling Street and 214 W. F Street were not purchased during the tax sale and that title will automatically be awarded to the City unless the Council objects. He expressed the opinion that it would be preferable for the City to have control over the parcels rather than the State. Stanchina indicated that Dickinson County has opted to do their own auctions starting in 2017 and that holding the auctions locally may increase the likelihood of adjoining property owners purchasing foreclosed parcels. Revord, Blomquist & Coe supported the acquisition of the properties.

It was moved by Alessandrini and supported by Revord to not object to the City taking tile of 510 Houghteling Street and 214 W. F Street.

#### **Adoption of Resolutions Re: Rental Inspection Fees**

Stanchina relayed that the unpaid rental inspection/registration fees were invoiced through the Single Lot Assessment process. He recommended that the remaining open invoices be special assessed.

It was moved by Alessandrini and supported by Coe to adopt a resolution of Single Lot Assessment for 303 W. H Street, 119 S. Stephenson Avenue, 118 W. Smith Street, 305 S. Stephenson Ave., 812 W. Fleshiem Street, 921 W. B Street and 708 W. B Street, as presented.

# Approval of Final Pay Request 2015 Street Improvements Re: Bacco Construction

Stanchina detailed the final payment request by Bacco Construction for the 2015 Street Improvements. Alessandrini stressed the importance of the Dickinson County Road Commission funds as they relate to the City's annual paving efforts. Stanchina conveyed that the City will have to look at solutions to cope with inaccurate cost estimates for local streets due to their base materials.

It was moved by List and supported by Coe to approve Bacco's final pay request in the amount of \$130,813.80 for 2015 street improvements.

# Consideration of Letter of Agreement Re: POAM Sell Back of Sick Leave

Stanchina outlined a request by the POAM to sell back up to 80 hours of sick leave with the funds to be placed in a deferred compensation account.

It was moved by Alessandrini and supported by Blomquist to approve the Letter of Agreement between the City of Iron Mountain and the Iron Mountain Police Officers' Association regarding the ability to sell back up to 80 hours of sick leave with the funds to be placed in a deferred compensation account.

#### **Authorization to Purchase Water Meters**

Stanchina noted that the City has many worn water meters and that they get less accurate with age, resulting in lost revenue. He explained that the new style of water meters have no moving part, a 20-year battery guarantee, tamper-proof features and would be compatible with an auto read system. Stanchina verified that it would not be cost effective to convert all of the City's water meters to an auto read system at this time. He stated that the oldest meters will be replaced first. It was moved by Blomquist and supported by Revord to approve the purchase of 150 IPERL water meters.
