#### **Request for No Charge City Park Pavilion Rental Re: Art for All**

Stanchina detailed a request by Art for All for a no-charge City Park Pavilion rental on June 24th and 25th for their annual event. Lana Frantz, Art for All Chairperson, stated that their event is a positive economic benefit to the community and that the proceeds fund event awards and a student scholarship.

It was moved by Alessandrini and supported by Stohl to authorize Art for All to rent the City Park Pavilion at a cost of \$220, plus security deposit of \$75, for June 24, 2015, and June 25, 2015.

#### **Consideration of Consultant Employment Agreement Re: Carol Bartolameolli**

Stanchina offered a Consultant Employment Agreement between the City of Iron Mountain and Carol Bartolameolli, the former Chief Financial Officer, to assist the current Chief Financial Officer, if necessary. He noted that the hourly cost would be \$30/hour with a maximum total cost of \$3,000.

It was moved by Revord and supported by Alessandrini to approve the Consultant Employment Agreement between the City of Iron Mountain and Carol Bartolameolli, as presented, with a total cost not to exceed \$3,000.

#### **Approval of Outdoor Lighting Replacement Re: Department of Public Works**

Stanchina outlined a request to repair/replace 14 exterior lighting fixtures at the Department of Public Works facility and install LED bulbs. He conveyed that the payback period for this project would be approximately one and a half years.

It was moved by Alessandrini and supported by Blomquist to approve the quote for the repair/replacement of 14 exterior lighting fixtures by MJ Electric in the amount of \$6,950, with a rebate of \$1,717.
