Kelly asked if the Dickinson County Conservation District was involved in the City's tree harvesting decision.

Presentation of Purple Heart City Resolution

Alessandrini read a resolution establishing the City of Iron Mountain as a Purple Heart City. Dale LaPalme, Representative for the Military Order of the Purple Heart, imparted that he will be ordering signs designating the City of Iron Mountain as a Purple Heart City at the City limits.

It was moved by Stohl and supported by Revord to approve the proposed resolution establishing the City of Iron Mountain as a Purple Heart City.

Motion Prevailed Unanimously

Discussion of Renaming 25 Location Park

Stanchina suggested the 25 Location Park be renamed "Kiwanis 25 Location Park" in an effort to recognize the efforts made by the Iron Mountain – Kingsford Kiwanis and to retain the park's history.

It was moved by Alessandrini and supported by Coe to name the 25 Location Park "Kiwanis 25 Location Park."

Authorization to Solicit Bids Re: 2016 Paving

Stanchina detailed several options regarding the City's remaining 2016 paving budget of \$155,000.

Approval to Rebuild 4x4 International Plow Truck #81

Stanchina recommended that the City Council authorize a rebuild of truck #81 due to the truck's low millage. He attested that all the quotes have been compared apples-to-apples and that it would not be beneficial to invest in a stainless steel dump box for this unit.

It was moved by Maule and supported by Alessandrini to authorize a rebuild of truck #81, a 1996 4x4 International Paystar plow truck, by Truck Equipment of Green Bay at a cost of \$49,910.

Consideration of Tax Tribunal Legal Representation Engagement Letter Re: Foster Swift Collins and Smith PC

Stanchina communicated that it would be ideal to retain the legal services of Mr. Van Coevering in the event the City goes to the Michigan Tax Tribunal over the Northern Star Industries case. Revord questioned what areas of the budget will be amended to cover the legal costs associated with the tax tribunal. Stanchina stated that he would review what projects could be removed from the City's budget prior to submitting a budget amendment due to legal fees associated with the Michigan Tax Tribunal

It was moved by Stohl and supported by Maule to approve the proposed engagement letter with Foster Swift Collins and Smith PC regarding the Northern Star Industries Tax Tribunal case and require the City Manager to receive further approval once the cumulative bill reaches \$5,000.

Approval of Resolution and Guidelines Re: Deer Management Program

Stanchina presented the resolution and guidelines for the 2016 Deer Management Program. He noted that the program documents have not changed from last year. Stanchina reviewed the areas that the City makes available for the hunt. It was moved by Coe and supported by Alessandrini to approve the 2016 Deer Management Program resolution and guidelines.

Approval of Payment Application #2 Bacco Constriction Re: Crystal Lake Blvd. Utility Improvements

Revord outlined the progress, costs and payment requests associated with the Crystal Lake Blvd. Utility Improvements. It was moved by Revord and supported by Maule to approve Application #2 by Bacco Construction in the amount of \$173,898.12 for the Crystal Lake Blvd. Utility Upgrade Project.

Amend Administrative Personnel Policy Manual and City Policy Manual Re: Travel Policy

Stanchina relayed that due to Internal Revenue Service Regulations regarding meal reimbursements for non-overnight travel, it would be most beneficial for the City to discontinue meal reimbursements for non-overnight travel. He indicated that both the City Policy and Administrative Policy books would need to be amended.

It was moved by Alessandrini and supported by Stohl to amend the Administrative Personnel Policy Manual and City Policy Manual, Policy #46 and -#3 respectively, to read: There will be no reimbursements for meals that are not part of overnight travel.
