Resolution Adopting Rate Increase Re: Iron Mountain -Kingsford Joint Sewage Authority

Stanchina presented a request by the Iron Mountain-Kingsford Joint Sewage Authority for a rate increase in the amount of \$7.00 per thousand cubic feet to upgrade the equipment at the Joint Sewage Plant. Alessandrini questioned whether or not a prevailing wage would be paid on this project.

It was moved by Revord and supported by Celello to adopt the resolution increasing wastewater treatment rate to authorize a rate increase to fund improvements at the Iron Mountain-Kingsford Joint Sewage Authority's wastewater treatment plant.

Stanchina imparted that the Downtown Development Authority has reconfigured Italian Fest and Oktoberfest to make use of the existing Downtown Performance Stage and that the adjustment would require the closure of Iron Mountain Street from Hughitt Street to East A Street between 7:00 a.m. and 11:59 p.m. on August 12, 2017, and September 23, 2017.

It was moved by Alessandrini and supported by List to approve the closure of Iron Mountain Street from Hughitt Street to East A Street between 7:00 a.m. and 11:59 p.m. on August 12, 2017, and September 23, 2017.
