# **Old Business**

# **Bid Opening Re: City Timber Sales**

Stanchina opened and read bids received for the City's timber harvest on 80 acres of Millie Hill and 40 acres east of Timberstone Golf Course. Brock VanOss was present to answer questions by the Council.

Bids received for Millie Hill: Frank's Logging: \$47,302.80; Minerick Logging: \$52,086.50; J. Carey Logging \$36,208.89; Triest Forest Products \$44,616.00.

Bids received for the location east of Timberstone Golf Course: Wender Logging: \$33,375.10; Minerick Logging: \$45,375.25; J. Carey Logging: \$27,186.29; L.P. (Louisiana-Pacific): \$36,726.92; Shamco Inc.: \$35,317.27; Frank's Logging: \$34,981.00.

It was moved by Alessandrini and supported by Revord to award Bid #1-Millie Hill to Minerick Logging for \$45,375.25 and Bid #2-Timberstone also to Minerick Logging for \$52,086.80, contingent upon Mr. Brock VanOss's review of all bid details.

#### **New Business**

# Consideration of Private Wells Request Re: 824 & 826 Spring St.

Stanchina outlined a request from property owners at 824 and 826 Spring Street seeking Council permission to install private wells. Stanchina noted that the locations are connected to the City's main via a 505' private water line that passes through approximately 175' of Romagnoli's parking lot. Stanchina informed the Council that the water line is currently leaking and, due to the hardship of replacing the entire water line, the homeowners are requesting permission to install private wells as an alternative. Stanchina noted that other homes adjacent to these homes currently have private wells and that the City does not intend to install water mains within this area in the future.

It was moved by Revord and supported by List to grant permission to the homeowners of 824 and 826 Spring Street to install private wells.

# Resolution to Proceed with the Redevelopment Ready Communities (RRC) Program

Stanchina outlined the resolution needed to proceed with the RRC Program. Stanchina informed the Council that the resolution is only a resolution recognizing the report and showing the intention to work toward addressing the items found within the report. Stanchina noted that the report outlines items that the City needs to change in order to become an RRC certified community.

It was moved by Alessandrini and supported by Blomquist to approve the "Resolution to proceed with the Redevelopment Ready Communities program of the Michigan Economic Development Corporation." **Motion Prevailed Unanimously** 

## Performance Resolution for Governmental Agencies Re: MDOT

Stanchina informed the Council that the Attorney General's office added some language to the "Performance Resolution for Government Agencies" to protect the State when a local government agency hires a contractor to perform work within an MDOT right-of-way. Stanchina noted that the language doesn't change anything the City already requires of contractors.

It was moved by Blomquist and supported by Coe to approve the "Performance Resolution for Government Agencies."

#### Establish a Public Hearing Re: Rezoning for the Village of Lake Antoine Plat

Stanchina outlined a Planning Commission recommendation to rezone a predominately residential area in the Plat of The Village of Lake Antoine from Business-2 to Residential-2. Stanchina noted that during the last five years there have been a number of single family homes built requiring variances and a current interest from prospective buyers to purchase a lot for a single-family residence.

It was moved by Blomquist and supported by Alessandrini to set a Public Hearing to rezone a portion of the plat of The Village of Lake Antoine from B-2 to R-2 on January 16, 2017 at 6:30 p.m. **Motion Prevailed Unanimously** 

# Participation in the Federal Excess Property program Re: MIDNR

Stanchina outlined the Federal Excess Property program which can provide needed firefighting equipment at no cost. Stanchina informed the Council that accepting the offered equipment is optional and the City is not required to take equipment that it does not want. Stanchina noted that participation requires a Cooperative Mutual Aid Fire Control Agreement with the MIDNR but that since we are almost all residential within our boundaries that the City would likely already be on any fire scene within the jurisdiction. Stanchina discussed the need for a ladder truck which this program may be able to provide.

It was moved by List and supported by Revord to approve the application to participate in the Federal Excess Property Program and to adopt the Cooperative Mutual Aid Fire Control Agreement.

# **Amendments to Dickinson County Solid Waste Management Plan**

Stanchina informed the Council that the Dickinson County Solid Waste Management Planning Committee reviewed the Solid Waste Management Plan and recommended a number of changes. Stanchina noted two clerical changes and an amendment that would allow waste to be landfilled in Delta, Menominee, Ontonagon, Schoolcraft and Alger Counties instead of 100% to Alger County, as a possible future option.

It was moved by Revord and supported by Stohl to approve the proposed amendments to the Dickinson County Solid Waste Management Plan.

Approval of Payment for Riverside Auto and Truck Sales Re: 2017 AWD Dodge Charger Stanchina informed the Council that Riverside was the low bidder at \$24,395 for a new 2017 AWD Dodge Charger squad car.

It was moved by List and supported by Alessandrini to authorize the payment of \$24,395 to Riverside Auto and Truck Sales for a 2017 AWD Dodge Charger.

Stanchina discussed the need to replace the City's thermal imager. Stanchina explained the effort of Deputy Director Jeff Friedenstab who applied for and was awarded a \$6,000 grant through the Firefighters Support Foundation to purchase a new thermal imager. Stanchina included three price quotes with the lowest price of \$6,000 from Pomasl Fire Equipment Inc. Stanchina recommended the purchase of a Flir K55 Thermal Imager Camera Kit with Truck Mount Charger from Pomasl Fire Equipment Inc. for \$6,000.
